Thesis Project: Diets of Scaled Quail in the Trans-Pecos

Scaled quail diets have been researched for several portions of Texas. These studies have described flora and fauna selection in various regions of the state during multiple seasons. My objective is to determine species diversity and percent forage of food consumed by scaled quail in the Trans Pecos seasonally in the next 2 successive years. Scaled quail will be harvested through the months of November to February for the 2 successive years. Crops will be collected from the harvest and will be analyzed and identified in order to show the percentage of supplemental feed and vegetation use. We will then compare percentage of the scaled quail use to determine if supplemental feed is a main resource for the scaled quail.
