Pay depends on earned credit hours at the time of application

- \$12/hour with <30 earned credit hours
- \$13/hour with 30-59 earned credit hours
- \$14/hour with 60-89 earned credit hours
- \$15/hour with >90 earned credit hours

Qualifications

- Must be pursuing a Bachelor's degree in a natural resource-related university program
- Ability to use a personal computer for basic reporting, documentation, and developing presentations
- Strong work ethic
- Organizational skills and ability to meet deadlines
- Must be willing to work independently and as part of a team
- Must be able to present findings at SRSU Symposium and at least 1 natural resource-related conference
- Dedication to work up to 19 hours/week
- GPA of >2.5 on a 4.0-scale
